**Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 18-25 January,**

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (WPCU) takes place each year from 18 to 25 January. This ecumenical celebration provides an opportunity to focus our prayers on Christian unity and to know that we are joining with international siblings in Christ.

This year WPCU takes Ephesians 4 v 1-13 as its central text which includes the words "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling." (Ephesians 4:4) Traditionally the week of prayer is celebrated between **18-25 January**, between the feasts of St Peter and St Paul.

**World Day of Peace - Sunday 18 January**

The Catholic Church marks the World Day of Peace, instituted by Pope St Paul VI, on 1 January each year. The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales designate the second Sunday in Ordinary Time as 'Peace Sunday' – on 18 January this year. We are encouraged to reflect on the message of Pope Leo XIV which is: Peace be with you all: towards an 'unarmed and disarming' peace. This is a challenging but exciting goal. He is telling us that peace should not rely on fear, threats, or weapons. Peace should have the capacity to resolve conflicts and open hearts through mutual understanding and hope.
